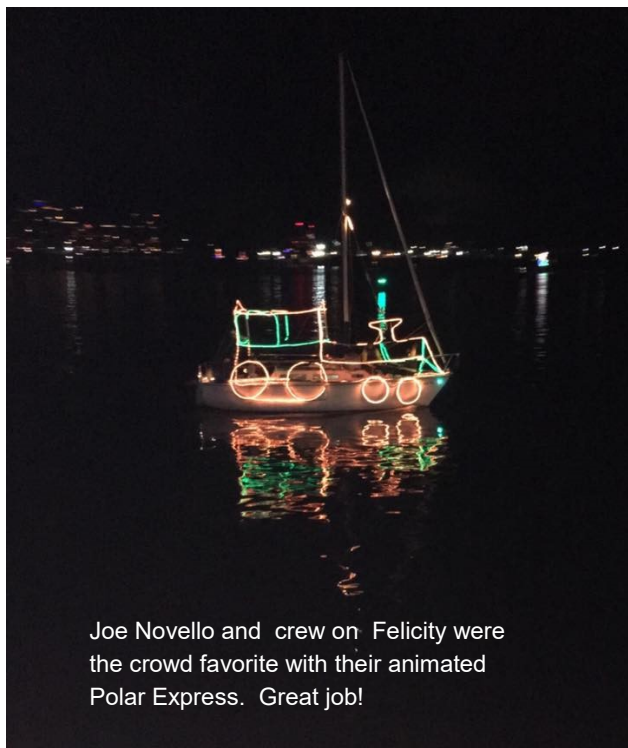
Merry Christmas; New Beginnings

December 15 Meeting is Christmas Theme



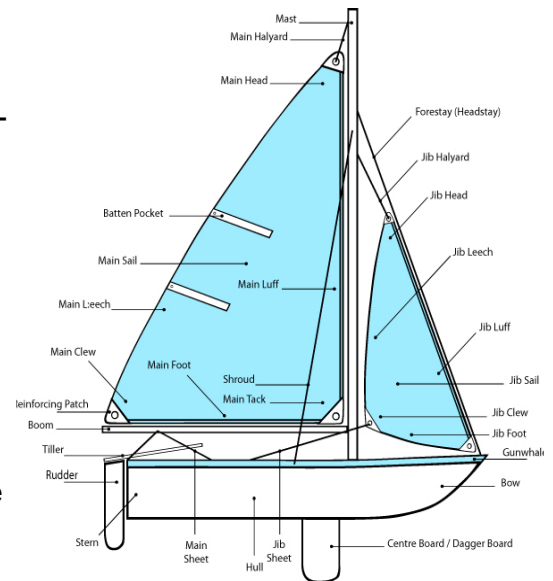

They're sponsored by Dorothy Bogumil and interested in learning about sailing, racing, and general boating. Please say hi when you see them and welcome them to the club!

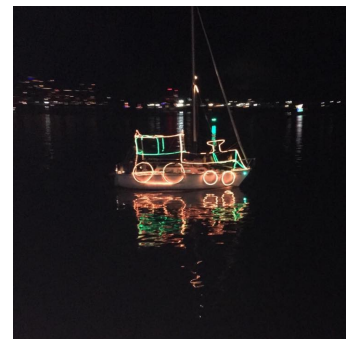
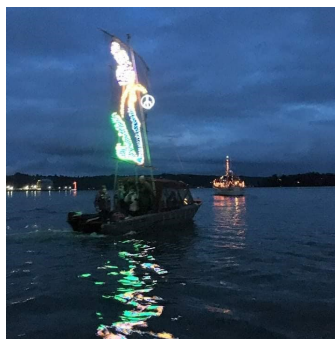
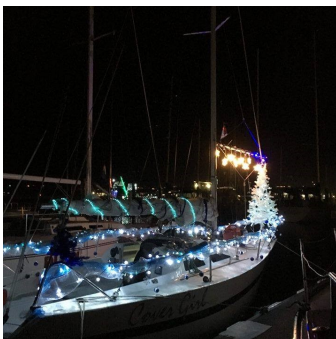
From the Archives, May 2004 newsletter excerpt
