December Race and Cruise News

Update from the Planning Committee:

The planning committee met with Jon Englund and Dean Fleck of Englund Marine, on 3 December, to gather information on their desired expansion to present to the board. As most of you know we have been approached by the pair to see if the YBYC board would be amenable to shifting our building over if needed to accommodate their desire to expand. Rather than putting the board on the hotseat to decide in front of Englund's team, the committee met to gather information to present to the board. The committee asked questions and came away with these main points:

- Englund marine is at the beginning of the process to figure out if expanding their current building is feasible and want to know from us if we are amenable to the possibility of moving to enable this
- Englund Marine's vision of the expanded building is to butt it up against the old building and go out 50-60' into the parking area. That would move the parking over 50-60' also.
- Englund Marine would utilize the old building still and keep the wharf and warehouse loading and unloading at the bulkhead end of the building and have no plans for in-water development.
- Englund Marine had not thought of compensation to YBYC for the inconvenience of moving and the loss of revenue but were open to the idea.
- Englund Marine had not thought of the idea of a shared building but were not immediately opposed to the idea, they would need to see what it would look like to be able to consider further.
- We left with Englund considering three options: move our building over, build a new building or build a shared building.
- Englund's loose time frame to get the project going is 1-3 years.

The planning committee presented this information to the board at the Dec 7 meeting. After discussions including maintaining a positive rapport with Englund and the questionable future of the club's lease/relationship with the Port, the following motion was made, amended, seconded and then passed unanimously: "Planning Committee shall let Englund Marine know that YBYC is open to working with them for a mutually beneficial outcome regarding the possibility of them expanding and possibly moving our clubhouse."

The planning committee is next scheduled to meet on Dec 15 and will let the Englund Marine team know the results of our discussion no later than Friday 17 Dec.
