All had a great time racing and complimented the great job done by the race committee. In the end Gordon Mattatall aboard H20Boa took 1st place in the Santana 20 fleet, Greg Krutzikowsky aboard Alchemy managed to edge out Matt Sprick on Tidy Cat by 1 point, and Laurie Weitkamp took 1st in the 420 fleet. But all out on the water were winners in the fabulous, fun event.

While many boats are being moth balled for the winter, there is still good weather to be had and opportunities to sail on Yaquina Bay through the rest of the fall and winter.
