Monthly Kayak Trip

Our monthly paddle trip for this month is on Saturday, November 14th. We plan to leave from the Oregon Boating Foundation Floathouse, paddle upriver and back into Poole Slough. Up and back it should be about 13-14 miles. The currents should be negligible (not greater than 1 knot), and the predicted tides should allow us to go back into the Slough 3 miles or so.

We will be leaving the Floathouse at 10:00 am and returning about 3:00 pm if we keep a reasonable pace. Plan to arrive at the Floathouse at least a half-hour early so we can be underway NLT 10:00 am. Dress appropriately for the weather conditions and water temperature, bring lunch/water, and dry clothes, etc.

At this point we have no way of knowing what conditions we may encounter, so check the weather before you leave home. If you are on our email list check it for any updates before leaving home.

Hope to see you on this month's trip; we've had several memorable ones this year so far. The December 19th paddle in Yaquina Bay could encounter some challenging conditions....stay tuned for further information.
