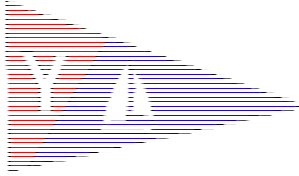

Members' Corner

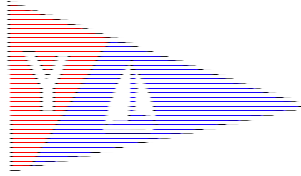

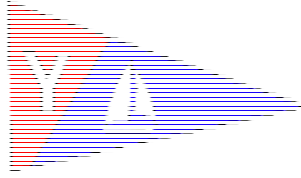

The Joy We Bring Others

It is always a great feeling to share our sailing experience with family, friends, and new acquaintances. I always remember the first time I went for a sail. I was fifteen years old and had been reading, watching, and dreaming about sailing for many years. Although I had never been out on a sailboat, I convinced my mother to drive me to Lake Merced in the middle of San Francisco to look at an eight foot El Toro that I was hoping to purchase for a mighty \$200.

When I arrived at the lake a kind elderly gentleman, Paul Dissing, the owner and builder of the boat asked me if I knew how to sail. Even though I said "no, but I've read a lot", he said get in and then pushed me away from the dock. I sheeted in the sail, and a gentle breeze took hold of the sail. In the span of thirty seconds I experienced sheer terror, confusion, then the most incredible excitement my young mind, body and soul ever knew. The boat began to heel over – panic; the boat stabilized at a slight angle but did not move forward – confusion; then ever so slowly it started moving forward until it hit hull speed – excitement!

Over the years I've never forgotten that feeling and try at every chance to share those wonderful emotions with anyone who has the desire. The secret is to minimize the terror, keeping it to just a fraction of a second if at all, then balance confusion and excitement in such a way to create the desire for more.

It is not just those out on the water who share our pleasure. While at a business meeting in Salem and associate mentioned she had been to the coast the previous weekend and took some great pictures of the visiting tall ships with a smaller sailboat in the foreground. Sure enough, there was Tenderly with another new friend out for their first sailing experience. The picture now adorns her office walls as a reminder of a special moment – watching, relaxing and dreaming.

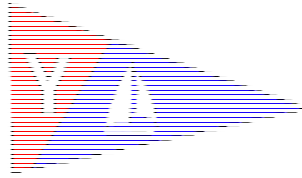

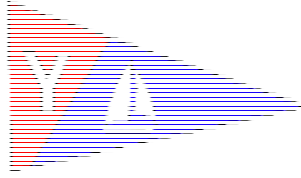

Education Spotlight

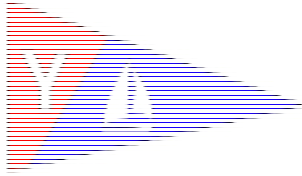
Education Spotlight *Sneak Preview*

Coming in May....

Adult Beginning Sailing Class – May 8, 10, 15, 17, 18, 22, 24, 25. The class is open to everyone regardless of skill level and is designed for the novice who wants to learn the basic skills of sailing. The class will focus on sailboat parts and rigging, boating safety, weather and tide considerations, and navigational aids and rules.

Complementing the classroom training will be 5 on-the-water, hands-on, sailing sessions to practice your skills in the club's Lido 14' sailboats. Classroom sessions begin May 8 and run through May 22 (Thursdays) from 7-9 p.m. at the YBYC Clubhouse. On the water sailing sessions take place on weekends, May 10 through May 25 (Saturdays and/or Sundays, excluding Mother's Day) from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. The exact times may vary.

Students are asked to provide their own personal flotation devices, to be worn at all times when on the water. Cost of the instruction, classroom materials, and training is \$175. Commodore's Log



Our Wednesday evening racing must be getting pretty serious. Two weeks prior to writing this we had six boats out in nasty misty weather, the kind that gets you soaked, more so than actual rain. It was so wet we just put all the gear, sails, fowlies, and gloves away still dripping. Thursday was spent drying the boat and gear as well as a much needed scrubbing of the deck. I went to the boat on Saturday to continue cleaning the interior, but got sidetracked talking to many different people on the dock.

Enter Jeff and Bernie. They are preparing their Wilderness 21 for an epic journey – from Vancouver BC to Mexico. Any time they are on the dock it is worth a visit to learn about their progress. Yesterday they installed the rebuilt mainsail, cut eight inches shorter to give more head clearance in the cockpit and bat cars installed so the sail can raise and lower faster. Future plans include lifeline netting, radar, roller furling, and heavier standing rigging. If you would like an up close and personal look, it is the red nameless boat moored about halfway down the E Dock at the Embarcadero. Bernie and Jeff plan to make the trip during the summer of 2009. Stay tuned as this is certainly a story worth following.

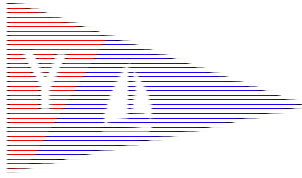

Summer Kayak Classes – Register Now

Learn to enjoy the pleasures of kayaking safely by enrolling in the “Basic Coastal Kayak Strokes and Rescues” class taught by Tom Murphy, an American Canoe Association Certified Coastal Kayak Instructor. As part of its community boater education program, the Yaquina Bay Yacht Club is offering this course to the public as a way to encourage the safe and enjoyable use of kayaks at the coast.

The class is 1-1/2 days and will begin on Saturday, June 28, from 12:00-3:00 pm. Class participants will meet at the YBYC Clubhouse (750 SE Bay Blvd.) for classroom instruction followed by a 3:30-5:30 pm session at a local lake for safety and rescue practice.

This experience will allow practicing the knowledge and skills learned the previous day. 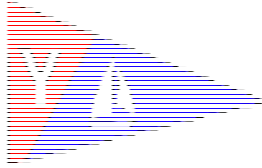
We decided the head in. After a little discussion about whether or not to motor-sail, I was outvoted and we continued under sail alone. Right after tacking onto a course to bring us to the jaws, we noticed something weird in the water about 400 yards south of our location. The water was churning and boiling in an area about the size of a football field. Curiosity got the better of us and we set a new course for the middle of the phenomenon. As we arrived we realized we were in the middle of a fish boil – millions of herring size fish jumping and swimming, churning the water in a most unusual way. We speculated they must be schooling up to protect themselves from some type of a predator. Without saying it out loud, I wondered if that predator had a taste for Catalina 22s. We were sorry we did not have a camera to capture the experience. It was very cool!

The sail to the dock was as pleasant as the leg going out. The squall did not catch us before we were safely tucked in our berth.

One never knows what to expect when out on the wild blue yonder. I hope you take advantage of every chance to get out on the water to experience your own adventures. I guess cleaning the boat will have to wait for another day...

Nautical Trivia

On old war ships it was necessary to keep a good supply of cannon balls near the cannon. But how to prevent them from rolling about the deck? The best storage method devised was to stack them as a square based pyramid, with one ball on top, resting on four, resting on nine, which rested on sixteen. Thus, a supply of 30 cannon balls could be stacked in a small area right next to the cannon.

There was only one problem -- how to prevent the bottom layer from sliding and rolling from under the others. The solution was a metal plate with 16 round indentations, called a Monkey. But if this plate were made of iron, the iron balls would quickly rust to it. The solution to the rusting problem was to make Brass Monkeys. Few landlubbers realize that brass shrinks much more and much faster than iron when chilled.

Dock work party on June 14

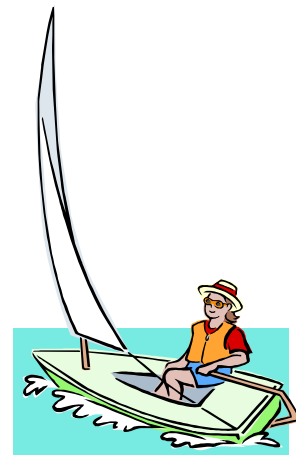

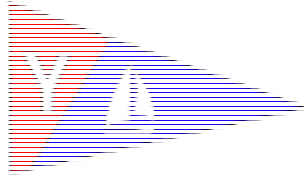

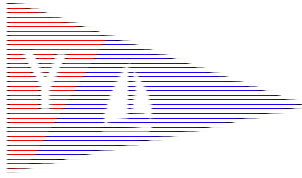

Participants will need to furnish their own wetsuits and Coast Guard approved life jackets which can be rented from local surf/dive shops or borrowed from a friend. July’s classes are full already, but please contact Tom for availability of other classes coming up this summer and fall.

Proposed Change to YBYC Bylaws

At November's general meeting, we will be asking the general membership to vote on the following proposed addition to the YBYC Bylaws:

“The approval of a memorandum of agreement of memorandum of understanding requires a majority vote of the Board of Directors at a Board Meeting.”

Q: What is a memorandum of agreement?

A: “A memorandum of agreement is basically a contract among entities where each will do/give something(s) to the other.” Diane Henkels

Q: What is a memorandum of understanding?

A: “A memorandum of understanding is more a reflection of aspiration of where the two or more entities would [like] their relationship to take them.” Diane Henkels

Q: Who are the Board of Directors members?

A: “Members: the Board of Directors is Composed of the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Secretary, Treasurer, and the Chairpersons of the eight Operational Committees.” (Bylaws of YBYC, Article VI(A))

Q: Why do we want to change the Bylaws?

A: Our current Bylaws are silent as to who can approve either of the above memorandums on behalf of the club. This proposed change would define the approval process of such agreements. Requiring a majority vote of the Board of Directors has value because these agreements could have ramifications that could affect the whole club.

Q: Has the Club ever entered into such an agreement?

A: Yes. A memorandum of understanding was entered into for the benefit of this year's youth sailing program.

Q: Does the Club expect to enter into these agreements in the future?

A: Yes. One expected use of a memorandum would be for an annual educational agreement with outside organizations and/or the Oregon Coast Boating Safety and Education Foundation. Another helpful use could be for documenting agreements between the Club and the Winery as it relates to the Seafood and Wine Festival.

If there are any unanswered questions, please feel free to contact me or any board member.

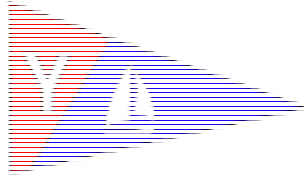

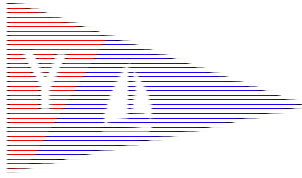

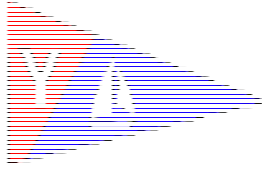

Lots of people helped clean up and do dishes, and it was thoroughly appreciated.

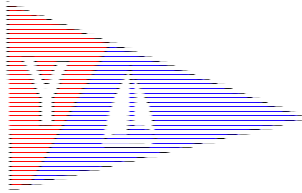

2009 Calendar

Pencil in the meetings and circle the regattas! Loyalty Days Regatta will be held April 25-26, Bridge to Bridge will be held August 8-9, Sailfest Youth Day will be held August 22, Columbus Day Regatta will be on October 10-11. Board Meetings will be held on the second Tuesday of each month, though some may be rescheduled to accommodate board member needs. Monthly meetings are held on the 3rd Saturday of each month, though this year has three exceptions: February's meeting is on Sunday February 15, April's meeting is on Saturday April 25 following the regatta's racing, and August's meeting is on Saturday August 22 as part of the Sailfest.

PHRF Certificates: a Change for the 2009 Season

Since taking over race chair responsibilities last year, the most difficult issue I've dealt with is enforcing our requirement that keelboats have PHRF certificates. For those in the club that don't race, we use the PHRF (Performance Handicap Racing Fleet) handicap system to score our keelboat fleet. Handicaps are determined by the organization PHRF-NW; each year, boat owners send in \$40 fee with their boat measurements and PHRF-NW provides a certificate with the handicap. Our policy has been to require a current certificate for a boat to have a rating; we score boats without certificates with a handicap of zero, a very undesirable rating. For both our Wednesday night races and our two regattas last year, about half of the boats participating didn't have PHRF certificates. At the regattas, most of the boats from outside of our club did not have PHRF certificates. To avoid mutiny at the fall regatta, I changed the sailing instructions at the last minute and assigned handicaps to the boats that didn't have PHRF certificates.

For all races during the 2009 sailing season, I want to change our policy and use the system that I used at the Columbus Day regatta. If a boat doesn't have a PHRF certificate, the race chair will assign a provisional rating. The provisional ratings will not be contestable, and most likely they will not be as favorable as the ratings provided by PHRF-NW. There were no complaints about this system at the Columbus Day regatta and I think it can work well for our other races as well. Sailors are still encouraged to get a certificate from PHRF-NW in order to get the best handicap for their boat and to support the PHRF-NW organization, but they can participate and be scored if they don't.

I'll write the sailing instructions for our Wednesday night racing next March or April. I plan to include this change, but of course if you have strong feelings otherwise let me know. I'm open to other ideas.

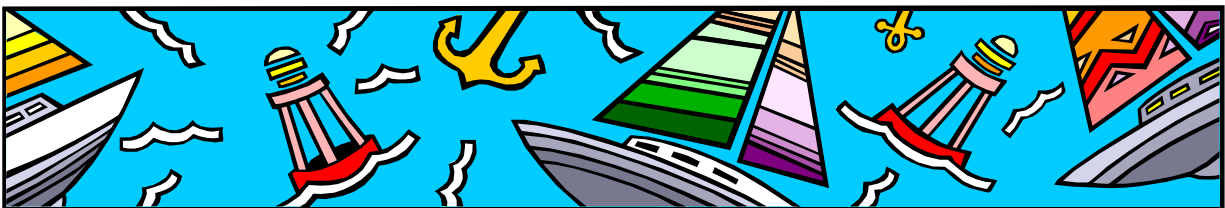

- Anchor and rode
- Fuel and Oil and Batteries
- Bailing Device
- First Aid Kit
- Fire Extinguisher(s)
- Necessary Tools
- Spare Parts
- Spare Line
- Extra Clothing or Blankets
- Fenders and Docklines
- Registration and Insurance Cards
- Provisions, beverages (beer, water)
