

Sailing News from 'Round the World



Around 1,500 children across Birmingham and Worcestershire have been introduced to sailing and windsurfing through the RYA's OnBoard grassroots programme this year. And on Sunday (12 September) some 40 of those rookies will descend on Bartley Sailing Club in Birmingham to put their new skills to the test at the 2010 Birmingham Partnership OnBoard Festival. RYA OnBoard is all about providing youngsters from local schools, community organisations and youth groups with opportunities to get their first taste of sailing and windsurfing and give them the chance to continue participating at low cost.

The sessions take place at six specially-designated OnBoard clubs in Birmingham and Worcestershire, which are considered recognised RYA centres of excellence for teaching and instruction, ensuring the kids get access to the best first experience possible to enjoy themselves while learning new sailing skills. This weekend's OnBoard Festival will see the new sailors, representing four of the six Birmingham Partnership OnBoard clubs, take part in a series of fun games and short races while it will also be the first time many of them will get to test their fledgling sailing skills against like-minded newcomers from other clubs. With another 1,500 kids getting their first taste of sailing and windsurfing this summer, an incredible 5,200 Birmingham and Worcestershire youngsters in total have now been introduced to the sports since OnBoard began in the region with no fewer than 48 schools across Birmingham and Worcestershire now linked with OnBoard. *Editors note: The Royal Yacht Associaton (RYA) is the national body for all forms of boating in the UK*.

Small boats (approximately Lido 14 and smaller) can hand launch at Port dock 7 near club. South Beach has a launch ramp and moorage; they can be reached at 541-867-3321.
