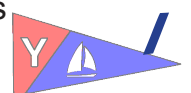
A special gratuity goes out to Don and Fran with Marine Discovery Tours for all their hard work

Monthly Hosts Needed; Open Dates Available

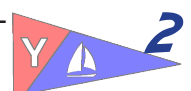
Please Volunteer to host a monthly Member Potluck!

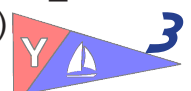
