April Race and Cruise News

This is the month that sailing season starts in earnest. Those who attended the preseason planning meeting opted to continue using the Portsmouth Yardstick for handicapping and decided on the following sailing season schedule.

We will kick off our 2019 season with a one day Spring Regatta on Saturday April 27th. This is designed to be a fun day of racing with dinner at the clubhouse to follow. Look for the Notice of Race coming soon.

Our Wednesday night Spring Series will start on the following Wednesday May 1st and will end on June 19 with a Fun Race on May 29 right after the Memorial Day weekend that will not count for the Series. Summer Series will start June 26 and run until August 14th with a Fun Race on July 3rd that will not count for the Series. Fall Series will start August 21st and end just before the Columbus Day Regatta on October 9th with a Fun Race that does not count for the Series on September 4th right after Labor Day weekend. Each of the Series will have 7 races. The sailing season ends with the biggest event of the year our Columbus Day Regatta on October 12-13.

High School Sailing Team in Full Swing

Our high school sailing team is in full swing, about half way through the season. We had our a regatta in Newport in mid March, and are heading to regattas in Port Angeles (April 13/14) and Hood River (April 20) in the next couple weeks.

Newport hosted high school sailors from Portland, Hood River and White Salmon, WA in a regatta on Yaquina Bay March 16. It was the second regatta of the high school spring sailing season in Oregon. There are currently only 3 facilities that provide opportunities for high school sailing in Oregon: Willamette Sailing Club in Portland, Gorge Sailing in Hood River and Yaquina Bay Yacht Club in



Newport. The Willamette Sailing Club hosts students from Lincoln High, Benson Polytechnic High and Oregon Episcopal School. The Gorge Sailing facility hosts students from Hood River Valley High and Columbia High which is across the river in White Salmon, WA. The Newport Cubs sailors practice out of the Yaquina Bay Yacht Club and the team includes both students at Newport High and home schooled students.

A total of 51 sailors participated in the regatta in Newport. The folks from Gorge Sailing in Hood River brought the 26 sailors, Willamette Sailing Club brought 16 and Newport had 9 sailors racing. These sailors were divided up into 5 teams from Hood River, 4 teams from Portland and 2 teams from Newport which meant there were 11 teams on the water for each race.

The weather forecast for the day posed a bit of a challenge with the forecast for variable winds of 6 miles and hour or less all day long. With an over 8 foot ebb tide on Yaquina Bay on Saturday that was not going to be enough wind for these 14 foot racing dinghies to be able to sail fast enough to not get swept out to sea over the bar into the 10 foot swell on the Pacific Ocean. Fortunately, the wind picked up to about 8 to 11 miles an hour just after noon and held for the afternoon. In all 14 races were sailed: 7 for the sailors in the A Division and 7 for the sailors in the B Division with at team being made up or at least 4 sailors, 2 racing in each Division.

The top Newport Cubs team came in 8th place for the day and included McKenzie Thomas as skipper in the A Division and Madisen Kinner as skipper in the B Division. Thomas finished 5th in her Division sailing with Chyanna Blackburn in races 1-3, Sara Rash in races 4-6 and Hailey Moats as her crew in the 7th race for their Division. Kinner finished 10th in her Division sailing with Moats in the first 6 races and Blackburn in the 7th race in their Division.

The second Newport team came in 11th place for the day and included Charli Adams as skipper in the A Division and Hunter Stewart and Kaydance Redwine sharing skippering duties in the B Division. Lauren Bobo-Shisler was crew for Adams in races 1-6 and Rash was crew for race 7. It is noteworthy that both Stewart and Redwine, had never been sailing until Newport Cubs started practices in late February this season. This was the first regatta that either one of them has skippered a boat.

In the end it was one of the five Hood River Valley High teams that came out on top for the day. But all the sailors were winners with big smiles on their faces after a great day of racing on Yaquina Bay. And a huge thanks to the many YBYC members who helped make the regatta a success!

We practice on Monday and Wednesday nights from 4-7pm, usually in front of the Embarcadero. Come see some fast sailing on the bay by the next generation of sailors. We have a relatively young team this year with lots of new sailors, but they rate at which they learning to sail is truly impressive!
