February 23rd 5:30pm Mike Harrington, Surfrider Foundation

Join us as Mike talks about the work the local chapter of Surfrider does in our community and how it affects our water.

The Newport Chapter of the Surfrider Foundation covers the geographical belt-line from Newport to Bend, Oregon. The local efforts are focused on protecting our beach's water quality through the Blue Water Task Force program. They have a very strong water quality testing program, in which our volunteers collect and test 400+ samples per year in locations ranging from Lincoln City to Seal Rock. The Chapter's robust beach cleanup program includes 30+ cleanups a year in the Newport area.

Historically in February the Newport Chamber Commerce arranges the Seafood and Wine festival. This event has helped local clubs, like ours, and nonprofits raise funds to augment their budgets. Recently, we heard that the event

was cancelled due to COVID. They will be offering an on-line version. This will make our budget a bit lean this year so we are open to ideas for fundraising! Don't forget to purchase YBYC items from the ships store!

8 BELLS Anne Marie Fehringer-Williams

August 19, 1954 – January 16, 2022

YBYC is sad to learn of Anne Williams' passing. She and husband of 37 years, Buzz, have been valued club members for over 25 years. Anne was a dear friend to many and will be sorely missed.

Anne was born in Nebraska and moved to Oregon in 1980. In addition to being a devoted wife and mother of Ian, Anne was an Asst. Professor of Textiles at OSU, a glass blower, teacher, world traveler, and avid sailor/racer with Buzz on their boat Slam Dunk. Their low-key, yet highly skilled style of racing is commendable and served them well.

Anne defeated a bout with breast cancer in the 1990s, but in 2018 it metastasized in her brain and continued to spread. In the midst of this battle, Anne contracted and survived a very severe case of COVID-19 requiring a lengthy hospital stay, two weeks on a ventilator, and over a month in rehab.

Her strength and courage are beyond admirable. Our deepest condolences to Buzz, Ian, and all who knew and loved her.
