### **High School Sailing Season Starts soon!**

Preparation for the 2022 high school sailing season is well underway. Coaches Greg Krutzikowsky, Terry Lettermaier and Laurie Weitkamp met recently to plan for the upcoming season. We've all lost count, but this is roughly a decade that YBYC has had a high school sailing team. The team sails in the club's 420 dinghies and uses the Oregon Boating Foundation's floathouse on Port Dock 7 as the base of operations.

The season will officially kick off on February 23<sup>rd</sup> with a parent-athlete meeting at 6:30 pm at the YBYC clubhouse. Weekly practices will begin on March 7. As in previous years, practices will be on Mondays and Wednesday, from 4-6 pm the first week, and 4-7 pm once daylight savings time kicks in on March 13. We typically sail in front of the Embarcadero, where currents and winds are usually favorable.

This year we plan to have our student athletes sail in three regattas: at Willamette Sailing Club in Portland on March 19, at Newport on April 16, and the Oregon Cup on May 7 at Hood River. These regattas follow the typical high school format, with lots (up to 20) of short races alternately sailed by the A and B fleets. Under this format, a "team" consists of one boat in the A fleet and one boat in the B fleet, and their scores are combined into the team score.

We need your help! There are several ways you can help make the 2022 season a success. First, we're looking for prospective sailors to join the team. Our sailors are in grades 7-12, but no sailing experience in needed. If you know kids who might be interested, please send them our way!

Second, we will need a lot of help for the Newport Regatta on April 16. We expect to have upwards of 50 sailors from Portland, Hood River, Newport, and perhaps Washington. We need volunteers to do everything preparing and serving lunch and snacks, running the chase boat, serving on the committee boat, or even walking sailors from the Clubhouse down to the dock where they'll get on the boats. Please mark your calendars now and we'll provide more details as we get closer.

Finally, come check us out! There are great views of the sailing action from the Embarcadero (and even some nice benches to sit on) for both practices (Monday and Wednesday nights) and our regatta on April 16. It's great to watch our sailors honing their sailing skills as they learn the life-long sport we all love!
