## **July Race and Cruise News**

Spring Series racing is all done, with Grinner being the clear winner of the series. Summer of course started with the solstice and we are now into the Summer Series races with two done plus the fun race where Grinner and Alchemy sailed up to Sawyer's landing to dock and the crews walked over the Mad Dog tavern. It was a fun sail both up and back, a nice change of pace, and a good time was had by all. Amazingly, the pool table at the Mad Dog is only a quarter a game!

We put out a call for cruise ideas and have gotten some suggestions. Some came from existing members and some from new members at the monthly potluck. The idea here is to get more butts on boats! # Monthly Member Potluck Saturday, July 15th


YBYC members and guests.,
