2019 High School Sailing Season Comes to a Close

The 2019 High School Sailing Season had its last practice and last regatta in mid May, ending another great year of youth sailing. It was quite impressive to see how much our sailors learned this season, since the majority were new to sailing--let alone racing—this year, and caught on extremely rapidly. Over the three month season, our sailors attended regattas in Newport, Portland, Hood River, and Port Angeles, and participated in nearly 30 practices on Yaquina Bay. Although we're losing our veteran sailors to graduation (Madisen Kinner



and McKenzie Thomas), we expect that many of our new sailors will return next year and bring their friends.

The last practice of the year was one of the few in which the light wind that propelled the sailors across the bay totally faded midway through the practice. With a weak incoming current and even weaker wind, try as they might it was impossible to reach the windward mark set a short distance upwind of the starting line. Since many of this year's sailors had come directly from the State Championship Newport Swim Team and all were wearing wetsuits, most of our sailors decided it was more fun to swim than sail without wind. Soon, the entire team was swimming around the boats, towing them across the bay and otherwise having a ball. For those of us watching the impromptu swim session (Grinner and Alchemy were close by getting ready for the Wednesday night race), it was wonderful to see how much pure fun they were having.

The last regatta of the year was the Oregon Cup State Championship Regatta, hosted the Willamette Sailing Club in Portland on May 18. Newport was one of 15 teams from five schools that competed in the field made up of over 60 sailors, who hailed from both Oregon and Washington. The other schools included Lincoln High and Hood River Valley High from Oregon and Columbia High and North Kitsap High from Washington.

Conditions on the Willamette River kept the race committee very busy because the winds shifted frequently and they had to keep moving the course and buoys to make the necessary adjustments. Winds also varied in strength from about 4 to almost 20 miles per hour. The weather varied from a mixture of sunshine and clouds to rain by the end of the day.

The Newport team was composed completely of our new sailors. Skipper Hunter Stewart and crew Lauren Bob-Shisler sailed four races together and ended up in 14th place in their division. Their best finish was 12th place, which is pretty impressive given that Hunter and Lauren had never sailed a boat before they joined the team in February. Chloe Burke, our youngest sailor, teamed up with Chyanna Blackburn and sailed two of the four races in their division. Again, both of these sailors are new to the team this year. They faced the toughest conditions of the day, when winds started gusting to 20 mph in their 3rd race. They were among several boats that capsized, and after righting the boat, wisely decided that conditions were a bit much for them and retired from racing for the day. While the Newport team finished in the back of the pack overall, it was a great experience for our sailor, not only for challenging conditions, but also for getting to know other high school sailors.

This year's season wouldn't be possible with out great support from all the parents and especially the coaches: Greg Krutzikowsky, Terry Lettenmaier, Laurie Weitkamp, Ron Yenchik, and Eli Adams. See you next year!
