We will open the YBYC clubhouse (750 Bay Rd, Newport, OR) on June 17th at 11:30 am for free sailing signups. (Weather and tide conditions permitting.) Coastguard approved lifejackets are always required on the boats. YBYC has loaner lifejackets.

- Sign up for the YBYC August adult sailing class until filled.


James Holley
