Editor's Turn: the new online YBYC Discussion Group

Introduction

A few of you have been to this site and have used it, but I'm hoping that the majority of Club members will use it before long. I think it's a great opportunity to fill a void in Club communication - meetings and newsletters happen just once a month, and all the things going on in the meantime have presented a challenge to include all members in.

The main advantage of an online Group like this is that it provides a simple way for notices to be sent out to the membership, and sent out by anyone. At the same time, the Group is "private" (at least at this point), which prevents anyone outside of the membership from participating.

Getting There

The Group is located at the address: http://groups-beta.google.com/group/ybyc. You can reach this in at least 3 ways:

1.) type the above address into your browser,

- 2.) starting at the main YBYC website at www.yaquinabayyachtclub.org, click on the "Members Only" link on the Home Page,
- 3.) at the very bottom of any emails from the Group, click on the link to "visit" the Group.

Layout of the site

Everything starts at the "Home Page", where all of the various features are visible.

The Home Page contains:

- 1.) a welcome message (under "Home"),
- 2.) a "Discussions" section, containing current and past topics of discussion from Club members
- 3.) a "Members" section, showing which of our Club members are included in the Group (limited to those that have submitted email addresses),
- 4.) a "Pages" section, in which web pages may be added with text, pictures, tables, charts, etc. by any Club member for viewing by other Club members

Personalizing the Group

Obviously, it will make the site much more useful to members if everyone goes into the site and provides their personal information. Most members have not yet, and you can readily see the value of everyone doing this when you go to the site. It will seem a little intimidating at first, but it can be done in two steps:

- 1.) In the "Members" section, find your entry (it will be shown as an abbreviated form of your email address) and click on it. In the next screen, click on "My Profile edit" that appears just over the blank face and just under the Google logo (actually, make sure to click only on "edit"). In the next screen, you can add a photo of yourself and fill in the blanks (well, at least your name, anyway). Click on "Save", then back out to the home page.
- 2.) From the Home Page, click on "Edit My Membership", which you'll find off to the right. That will take you to a screen where you can change your preference in how you get notified of Discussion postings, and also let you change your nickname that shows up on the site.

Posting Messages

It's really not difficult to post messages to the Discussion Group. There are two ways

- 1.) From the Home Page: click on "+ start new", which is found at the right end of the blue "Discussions" bar. Everything should be self-explanatory from there.
- 2.) From your own email program: just send an email to ybyc@googlegroups.com. Any such emails will automatically be posted to the "Discussions" section without you even visiting the website The subject line of your email will show up as the subject for that discussion.

Just remember that any messages you post will be going to all Group members, so don't send a message with just one recipient in mind.

This Group has been developed as a "private" one, and membership has been limited solely to YBYC members so far. That means that anyone not registered with the Group may not participate in Discussions.

Responding to Messages

It's just as easy to reply to an email from this Group as to any other email, but all of us need to remember that a reply from one of us is a message that goes back out to the entire Group (i.e., all Club members) and not just the person writing the message. This has obvious advantages over sending emails to individuals, but it's a departure from how email usually works and needs to be considered when replying. This certainly should not discourage anyone from participating, but is just something that needs to be recognized.

As with posting original messages, responses may be posted through either the Home Page or through your own email program.

Summary

I think this site will give the Club a number of things it hasn't had with it's other resources. Unlike the web page, it's private - those not registered for the Group may not even view it. So we now have a way to share private Club information (budget information, membership roster, etc.) with the general membership.

The real beauty of this Discussion Group is that it requires no maintenance. Once all the YBYC members were added, anything else became entirely up to YBYC members. Have fun with it!

Secretary

Blaine agreed he would be in charge of postings on Google. We need to put information out to the membership. Tom suggested a one-sheet instructional handout for the next meeting.

Rogue Commodore's Challenge Cup

The Roque Commodore's Challenge Cup is intended to be a challenge by YBYC to the Triton and

Eugene Yacht Clubs of Eugene Oregon. The Challenge Regatta is to be held once each year.

- 1. Six race, one throw out
- 2. Boat class to be determined by the holder of the cup, unless mutually agreed upon by all clubs participating in the regatta
- 3. Boats will be sailed by a minimum of two members from each club.
- 4. Boats must be of a one-design class and sail to the rules of that class.
- 5. US Sailing Rules will apply.
- 6. Each club will provide their own
- boats, unless mutually agreed upon by all clubs participating. Each club will ensure the boat they are using is properly insured.



- 7. The holder of the cup will host the annual event and provide all necessary support both on and off the water.
- 8. The races are to be "Round Robin", with boats and crew rotated after each race (Each club will sail each boat at least twice during the regatta)
- 9. Only club members from participating clubs are eligible to skipper and crew the boats
- 10. Each club member may skipper only for two races.
- 11. The Challenge Cup trophy will originally be provided by The YBYC and will

your involvement. Every Wednesday evening a group of sailors sail around the navigation marks and calls it a race. Each race requires a committee boat to start and finish the race. All the sailors would love to be able to race rather than sit anchored in the bay, fishing, crabbing, drinking wine and eating cheese.


