Beginning Tuesday, May 27th and continuing through labor day the Oregon Boating Foundation Float House will be open for junior Yaquina Bay Yacht Club members to check out boats for recreational use. Adult club members will check out JY Trainer and El Toro sailboats for youth to sail around the marina and in the bay in front of the Embarcadero Condominium Complex. A chase boat will be manned to ensure a safe afternoon sail for all participants. The program is open to any club members but is mainly focused on kids.

Bridge to Bridge Offshore Race 2014

The Bridge to Bridge Offshore Race for this year is coming up again on the third weekend of August. The weekend starts with a send-off at the new meeting room of Astoria Yacht Club on Friday night. The start of the race is at the mouth of the Columbia River at about 6:AM, depending on the tide. It proceeds down the coast through the day and night with boats beginning to finish in the early morning hours. The record time for the race is10 Hrs 45 Mins. Finishing crews are met at the finish line and shown to the dock where they are greeted by our welcoming committee. Smiles, warm handshakes, hot towels and cold beers are the reward for crews. The weekend is capped off on Sunday afternoon with a great meal, traditionally a whole roast pig, and celebration. Trophies are awarded and stories swapped as the weekend wraps up.

If this sounds like something you want to take part in, then here's what you can do: enter your boat, crew on a boat, stay up all night meeting and greeting boat crews, smile and hand out hot towels or cold beers, prep and cook and everyones favorite, clean up the mess.

The hardest thing to do, actually, is enter a boat in the race. Boats have to meet equipment and safety requirements that include some expensive equipment. Not to mention the most important requirement: a solid, seaworthy boat that is ready for sailing in all conditions off the Oregon coast. If you have a boat that is ready for offshore racing or know someone who has a boat that may want to enter, you should do it. Get an entry in. June Race and Cruise News

June is when summer begins, but not till late in the month. We still have Spring Series races in June. The first Wednesday race this month featured some strong gusty winds with gusts to about 30kts registered at the wind sensor located by the NOAA docks. Winds that strong, shifty, and gusty challenge both sailors, boats and gear. For some it was loads of fun, some found the limits of some of their gear, some considered discretion the better part of valor. It is well worthwhile to closely examine your boat to evaluate if it is ready to take on the stresses that come with these conditions before setting out. There was damaged rigging, torn sails and boats that found the bottom. Fortunately no one was hurt and most folks did enjoy the sailing that they did. We'll see what the next couple of months brings, but this is typically the windiest time of the year that most of us take to the water for sailing.

We now have sign ups for both chase boat and committee boat for Wednesday racing online in the same place that folks sign up for the 420s. We still have one slot open for committee boat on June 18 for Spring Series and almost all the slots are open for Summer Series, so if you haven't been committee boat this season please sign up soon to get the date(s) you want. Chase boat drivers are still needed too. Wednesday evenings is a great time to be out on Yaquina Bay no matter what type of boat you're in.

Speaking of summer, the official solstice is on June 21 and to celebrate the longest or shortest day of the year in their hemisphere many sailors around the world are celebrating Sailstice. YBYC is planning an outing on the ocean to Yaquina Head if the weather permits. We will be meeting at the clubhouse at 9 AM, and heading out to sea if it looks good. If the ocean does not look so inviting we can still sail in the bay to celebrate Sailstice .

HISPANIOLA IS FOR SALE

The sailing vessel Hispaniola, a Catalina 27, is now for sale by her owners, Pat and Mike Blackburn. She is a 1974 standard rig, standard cabin layout, outboard engine model. She is a fin keel with 4' draft, which is handy in the bay, and she is especially at home in coastal cruising off our local shores. Hispaniola has a two reef, partial batten main, 140, 130, 100% and blade foresails. She is fully set up for spinnaker sailing as well. She has been well maintained and recently upgraded with safety in mind: Lifesling II in fiberglass case is mounted on the stern rail, a heavy-duty web jackline attaches to hard points, the Standard Horizon GX2150 vhf radio has a built-in AIS receiver to monitor large vessel traffic and DSC for emergency broadcasts. The GX2150 is connected to the Lowrance LMS330C chartplotter/fishfinder/GPS so vessel locations are plotted relative to Hispaniola's location at all times and her location is automatically broadcast via DSC in the event of an emergency. GPS data is also communicated to the Simrad TP32 tiller pilot. The TP32 is the top of the Simrad line of tiller autopilots for sailboats up to 37' and 12,600 Pounds displacement.

The accommodations include a full set of cabin cushions, shore power, GFCI protected outlets, microwave, fresh water tank with hand-pump faucet and a working marine head. Two deep cell 12 volt house batteries are charged by a smart marine charger. Three adult sleep comfortably on board with all their gear and groceries. A combination of children and adults, up to 5 or 6 can do the same.

The current engine is a 1998, 9.9 HP Johnson 2 stroke. Remote throttle and cables are in place but not connected to this engine. The engine has been maintained regularly, runs great with plenty of power and has a new prop.

She is registered through 2015 and Embarcadero moorage is paid through March of 2015. So the sooner someone buys her the better deal they will get. In other words, the remaining months of moorage are included in the asking price. That price is...(call Mike Blackburn at (541) 570-0498 and leave a message if I can't pick up)
