We had three Thistles plus a 420 in the Centerboard fleet, seven Santana 20s, a fleet of nine keel boats that included a Catalina 38, a Capri 25, a J 24, a Martin 241, a Merit 25 and four Wavelength 24s. It was a challenging regatta in more ways than one.

Saturday brought strong winds and heavy rains with gusts peaking at over 40 miles per hour as a deep low pressure system passed just to our north. Much of the moisture embedded in the system was from the remnants hurricane Oho. But Diane Henkel's race committee kept the fleet on standby hoping to get some races in later in the day. With Dorthy Bogumil's awesome breakfast fare and hot clam chowder at lunchtime, followed by a screening of Master and Commander courtesy of Ken and Stephanie Brown things were pretty cozy at the clubhouse. As the front passed the winds eased and sun even broke through. We were able to get two races off in what turned out to be great sailing conditions. Most sailors kept the faith and went out to glory in the brisk late afternoon breeze.
